IPC recognizes "Right to Know Week 2011" with educational outreach at Ontario hospitals

TORONTO, September 26, 2011 – The Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner, Ontario (IPC) will host educational outreach tables at more than a dozen hospitals across the province this week to recognize "*Right to Know Week 2011*."

Countries and organizations from across the world will commemorate *Right to Know Week* from Sept. 26-30, 2011 to raise global awareness of individuals' right to access public information and to promote access to information as a fundamental human right.

The emphasis of the IPC outreach is to educate hospital staff, and the public, on Freedom of Information (FOI) legislation. Hospitals will fall under Ontario's *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (*FIPPA*), for the first time, as of January 1, 2012. The full outreach calendar is posted on the <u>IPC web site</u>.

The introduction of *FIPPA* will not change the protection of Ontarians' personal health information, but will give the public a broader right to access records under a hospital's custody or control, including those relating to administrative and operational functions, policy and financial considerations.
