

ROUND ONE SMART CITIES



- Municipalities can collect information
 - Transit smart cards
 - Credit card-capable parking meters
 - Photo Radar Traffic cameras
 - Photo Radar School zone cameras
 - Transit bus video cameras
- License Identification
- Facial Identification
- Need for private sector legislation



ROUND ONE SMART CITIES

- "Smart Cities" projects are more than Sidewalk Toronto they are everywhere
- These are CITIES!
- New ballgame for private sector partners
- Legislation?
 - Data Trusts
 - Ont/Sask private sector





- No Public Interest Disclosure provision
 - Limited LA FOIP ss.18(3), ss.28(2)(n)
- Doctor's Billings
- Consultant reports
 - Municipal legislation
- Mandate Letters
 - Disclosable



ROUND TWO PUBLIC INTEREST DISCLOSURE

- When is disclosure in the "Public Interest"?
 - Scrutinize public spending Doctor's billings, Bombardier
 - Executive misconduct Algoma Public Health
 - Political transparency Ministerial Mandate letters

- Do the media have a right to follow police scanners?
- Should media access be built into any upgrades?
- Public interest versus private interest

 - Mackenzie Health






- Humboldt Broncos

 - 380 breaches
- Naming of snoopers
- Principle, Need to know
- Circle of Care





- Making recommendations
- Have proposed binding recommendations
- Trend across Canada





ROUND SIX ORDER MAKING POWER

- Ordering power (on access side only) since inception (1987)
- Full order-making power under PHIPA, ARA and Data Integration
- 97% of Health files resolve short of formal decision.
- Just like curling it's always good to have the "hammer"



ROUND SEVEN DATA MATCHING, LINKING, ANALYTICS

- Data Matching Agreements Act
 - Passed 2018
 - Not proclaimed
- Justice working on Regulations
- Allows certain organizations to initiate data matching projects
- Allows government institutions to initiate data matching projects



- How can government use data analytics to improve services?
- If the privacy "silos" go, what replaces them?
- Ontario's data integration scheme approved Spring 2019
 - IPC oversight
 - Designated units
 - IPC-approved data standards
 - Public interest must be considered
